Free/Reduced eligibility can help to determine other benefits such as AP costs, possible P-EBT benefits and others. Just because everyone is eligible for free meals this year does not mean that they are eligible for additional benefits. Applications can be filled out manually or electronically.

If filing manually - either request an application to be sent to your house or print one from the school website at http://www.baypath.net Click the Parent tab and select Free and Reduced Lunch under the Cafeteria section. Fill out all required fields and either send to school with your child or mail to:

Set up an account using your child's information. Once the account is set up-click Submit Application. Fill out all required fields and submit.

Applications can be submitted at any time throughout the year. All families qualifying through Virtual Gateway will receive a letter of eligibility through the mail. Free meal benefits are extended to all children within a household if one child qualifies through Virtual Gateway.
